A Shire's 12th night

Having been to at least ten of our "Shire's Twelfth Night" celebrations, this time I was struck by how intimate the night's festivities seemed to me. I missed the opening welcome played out in the balcony above the events room, but did arrive in time for the dancing, led by Baroness Aseneth. There were at least a half-dozen different dances being taught by the Baroness and everyone was able to perform them in a reasonable fashion and were all having a good time circling around the dance floor. Anyone who knows me is aware of my foot problems and the difficulty I have in standing for any length of time, but I have to tell you that I considered more than once jumping up and



joining in the fun. The Ladies were happily moving with the music provided by our Barony's famous musical group 'Fracta Modi' and the Lords were just as charming in their attempts at keeping up.

Next, I drifted into the feast room for a taste of the 'day board' so temptingly spread out for all to enjoy, then wandered from table to table sometime introducing myself and always delighted by the games our Shire guests played and the arts and crafts they were working on.

A Shire's 12th night continued:

Upon hearing much laughter and shouts of delight from the events room I moved back in to see what it was all about. Have you ever seen the game of wolves, lambs, and shepherds? Well I don't know how to describe it exactly. I'll try. Picture a pile of stuffed animals representing a flock of sheep (three of them). Now, standing above those sheep is a shepherd and on their hands and knees protecting the sheep are two blindfolded Sheppard dogs. From across the room slinks three others, not blindfolded, representing the wolves. Their goal is to steal the sheep without being caught (touched by the blindfolded shepherd dogs). The Sheppard stands above them and attempts to guide them toward the oncoming wolves with voice commands. I don't know how successful either side was (the players were switched several times). But I could see and hear from the laughter and shout of encouragement that everyone truly enjoyed the sport.

After sweeping up the debris from the wolves & dog battles the famous Barony of Smoking Rocks apple bobbing began. It is like no other such event that I have ever witnessed. There are apples bobbing about to be sure, but no water barrels. These apples (two of them) bob from each end of a head high string hanging from opposite ends of a spinning axle spoke. The two opponents attempt to take a bite of one of the apples, sometimes indeed the same apple. The strategy usually employed is to try to keep your opponent away from his apple by causing the apple he is pursuing to spin away from him and at the same time attempting to bite the other apple. As often as not the two combatants scuffle for the same apple knocking into each other and many times one or both end up on the floor. O yes, each participant is required to keep his hands behind his back under his belt. Almost always both opponents survive and one bites the apple thus is declared the victor.

The highlight of the evening of "Twelfth Night" is a feast meant for a King. Our King and Queen of the Bean that night were Russell Fareas and his beautiful wife. They were seated at the center of the head table while each guest couple was announced and the presented to the royal couple. As the guests entered the feast hall they paraded to a special musical presentation, A Pavane, played again by 'Fracta Modi '. When all had entered and found their places the royals of the night wished us a fair hello and announced that all should 'take what rest ye may', we were all invited to be seated. The feast was plentiful and there were many toasts offered to our kingdom royals and lesser nobles. A display of singing was performed by Lady Lauralie. All the while more of the "Islamic Feast of the senses provided by our own Puck who has come back from the East brimming with ideas for delectable treats never before dined on in our fair Shire in Northumbria". There was also a presentation of a drama starring Baron Cerdic, Master Paidraig and his wife Lady Tatiana, Lady Angela Costello, Lady Lauralie, and Lord Ulric von der Insle . So it begins:

Maybe it is just courtesy. Either way I welcome guys to hit me as hard as they would anybody else if they get close enough to do so. I like this cause the older and more injured I get I still feel useful.
